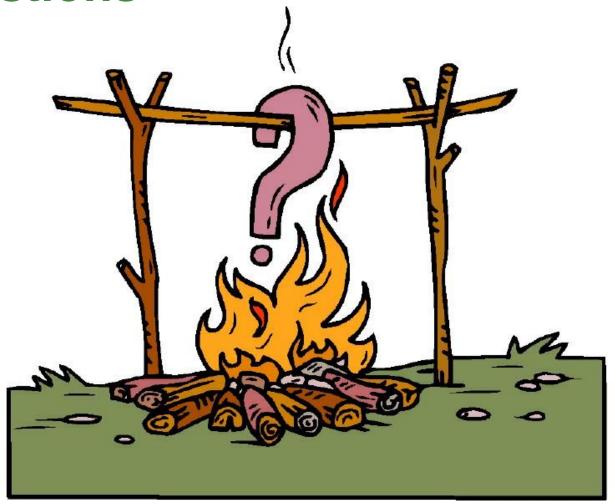

This is a block grant under the ESSA and, <u>as</u> <u>long as funds are appropriated each year from the federal government</u>, all districts should be eligible to receive an allocation.

- Due May 30, 2019

  - Small changes to dollar amounts

  - Expected to be addressed as carryover

## **FY19 Carryover**

- As per the Federal Programs Handbook on page 56-57, LEAs may obligate Title IV, Part A funds during the federal fiscal year for which the funds were appropriated and during the succeeding federal fiscal year for a total period of 27 months of availability.
- While there are no restrictions for the carryover of Title IV, Part A funds, LEAs with <u>large carryover amounts (25%+)</u> may be monitored and/or provided technical assistance to address the excessive carryover amounts.
- When funds are carried over, LEAs must ensure that they
  have a process and internal controls in place to track
  unspent funds from the prior year in addition to the current
  year fund requirements and be able to show how total funds
  were spent according to the Title IV, A focus area.

# FY19 Carryover—Meeting the Focus Area minimums

CLIP Budget

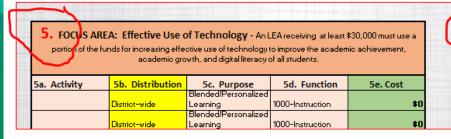
- LEAs that received and/or budgeted more than \$30,000 on the FY19 Title IV, Part A budget are required to have expenditures in each focus area of Well-Round (Section 3 of summary worksheet) and Safe/Health Students (Section 4 of summary worksheet) totaling at least 20%.
- If the statute minimum is not met by the end of the fiscal year, the LEA will be responsible to re-allocate the unspent funds directly to the matching focus area on the FY20 budget during the carryover process.
- Furthermore, the statute requires that no more than 15% (Section 6 on the summary worksheet) of the portion allocated/budgeted to the Effective Use of Technology (Section 5 on the summary worksheet) be utilized to purchase infrastructure.
- If FY19 actual infrastructure expenditures exceeds the allowable percentage based on actual FY19 Effective Use of Technology portion expenditures, the LEA will be responsible to re-allocate the unspent portion directly to the ET focus area on the FY20 budget during the carryover process.
- A FY20 budget tracking workbook will be provided to assist LEAs in the tracking of this data.

# SRO-Continued/Expanded/New Programming

- Continued SRO activity in FY20
  - demonstrate the continued need
    - Effectiveness measures
  - include/articulate data in FY20 CLIP
  - Demonstrate that the SRO meets a specific, identified need beyond 'just' providing security
    - integrated into a larger system of planning, prevention, and sustainability of student wellness initiatives in the district
    - this can take the form of training and professional development provided by and with the SRO for staff, teachers, administrators, parents, and students.

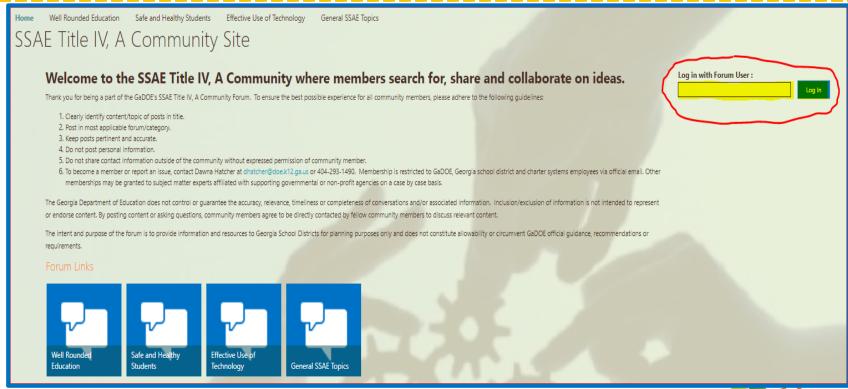

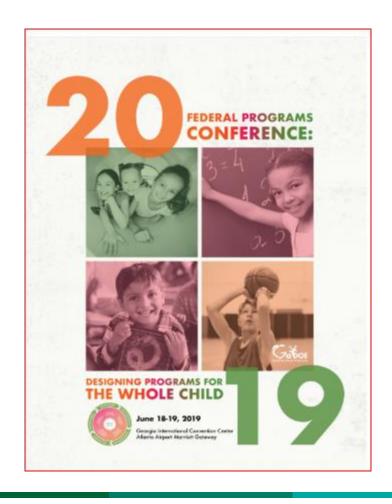

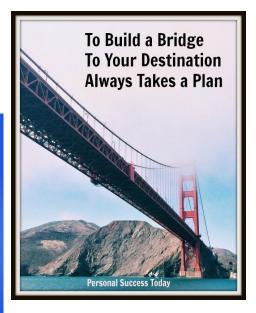
